Robert E. Armitage, FCSI Memorial Award

BACKGROUND

Robert E. Armitage, a Maine Registered Architect was instrumental in the founding, and the first President of the Maine Chapter of the Construction Specifications Institute. In 1984 he received the distinguished honor of Fellowship in the Construction Specifications Institute. At that Awards ceremony, he was specifically cited for “his notable service to the Institute through continued participation in the Maine Chapter and his dedication to the administrative affairs and leadership of the Northeast Region CSI”. He had remained a member of good standing in the Institute from his application in 1966 until his death on March 14, 2014. Bob continuously lived the code of ethics of CSI and strived to constantly promote the ideals and objectives of the organization. He was an extremely dedicated member in all aspects of the Institute. Though, Bob is no longer with us, his exemplary commitment will remain through the establishment of this Memorial Award which will be given to an individual whose involvement attempts to replicate the ongoing dedication of Robert E. Armitage, FCSI.

AWARD CRITERIA

Recognition to any member of the Maine Chapter CSI who has made significant and meaningful contributions to the Construction Specifications Institute as exemplified by the example established and demonstrated by the life of Robert E. Armitage, FCSI.

AWARD COMMITTEE

The Committee consists of the Executive Committee of the Maine Chapter CSI. They will consider, review and make preliminary consideration for the “best” Maine Chapter CSI candidate nominee who most closely exemplifies the zealous commitment and service of Robert E. Armitage, FCSI. The Committee will formally prepare and present their nominee for a final approval by the Maine Chapter CSI Board of Directors.

FORM OF AWARD

The Award will be an engraved plaque identifying the Maine Chapter CSI and its logo, the Robert E. Armitage, FCSI Memorial Award and the name of the honored recipient.

NOTIFICATION

The President of the Maine Chapter CSI will notify the recipient of the Award prior to the Annual Maine Chapter CSI Awards Night and invite the recipient to be the guest of the Maine Chapter at the Awards celebration.

PRESENTATION

An overview presentation will be made, by the Maine Chapter President, at the Annual Maine Chapter CSI Awards Night. It would be fitting and most appropriate to also invite Nancy Armitage, Bob's wife of 55 years, as "a very special and honored guest" of the Maine Chapter, to present the plaque of this Memorial Award to the recipient for their contributions to CSI.
